Homely Escapade

A COMPLETE INTERNAL RENOVATION AND EXTERNAL FACELIFT TURNED THIS HOME INTO A PRIVATE RESORT VILLA.

This semi-detached house in Serangoon Gardens was restructured, reconfigured and transformed into a luxurious two-storey bungalow. Designer Ron Leow from Asialand ID took inspiration from high-end contemporary resorts, and wanted to imbue the house with a similar vibe.

To achieve that, Ron had to give the home a drastic facelift and a new internal layout. Three solid wooden beams were added to the façade of the house to support the clay roof tiles in the front, and major renovations were carried out to give the interiors a completely new layout.

HOLIDAY AT HOME

The new house has enlarged spaces, six bedrooms with en suite bathrooms, and a natural, easy flow of light and air. The entire

first floor is surrounded by folding doors and fixed glass panels that give the space an open feel. Ron made sure that the homeowners could throw open the doors that line the walls and achieve an interior that blurs the lines between interior and exterior.

To achieve the look of a resort villa, Ron placed plenty of greenery around the bungalow. Lush planter pots are lined up on the side, terrace and back gardens of the house.

Long strips of timber teak run throughout the entire first floor, covering the living room, dining area and the adjoining kitchen. The open concept feels luxurious when paired with the wooden flooring, and simply cements the resort look and feel. Further playing up this concept is the television feature wall. Here, Ron used textured processed strips to form a rough, stone backing for the mounted TV set.

Similar woody tones and earthy colours are found in the dining area and the kitchen. A square, dark solidwood dining table strikes a formidable impression in the slightly-raised dining space. In the kitchen, Ron covered the countertops with Cuban Palisander marble laminates that enhances the luxe feel.

Over in the master bedroom, Ron replicated the levels of luxury found in high-end tropical resorts. Here, a U-shaped walk-in wardrobe was created, with exotic wood laminates. A study table is suspended from the wall, along with a cabinet feature. The TV console feature wall is made from a mix of dark brown leather laminates and Corda Makassar laminate.
